### Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Guardians and Friends of Waimea High,

There is excitement on campus as this week is filled with Homecoming activities, ranging from dress up days, noon time rallies and our Homecoming Assembly scheduled for this Friday.

At the recent Board of Education Community Meeting held on September 29<sup>th</sup> at the Hanapepe Library, each Principal was asked to speak about highlights at their schools. For Waimea High there are great things happening:

This summer, five of our English Language Learner students traveled to Oahu to attend training along with students from 23 other high schools. Students were trained on the usage of the Bloomberg Station and educated on chapter processes and policies. They are now a chapter of Akamai Financial Academy. The program teaches students about the stock market, assets, stock analysis, portfolio management and much more. It is a year long competition in which the different chapters create portfolios balancing stocks between different sectors. The school with the best portfolio each month receives a monetary prize. Each week the schools are ranked, we are proud to say that for the past four weeks Waimea High School placed within the top five. Our students work together as a team and meet twice a week after school and sometimes more. The students watch weekly web-casts and take weekly quizzes. The knowledge they gain from the web-casts each week is applied to their portfolio management. During the fall break, three Waimea High School students traveled to New York City along with students from the other 23 schools. They visited Bloomberg headquarters, Wall Street, and a number of different firms.

Cadet, Lt. Col. Angelica Tran received the Legion of Merit Medal (equivalent to the Legion of Valor military service) no other cadet in the state has received this award. Congratulations Angelica! Our JROTC numbers have increased from a low of 74 cadets in SY 09-10 to a current enrollment of 125 this school year. They continue to participate in community service activities, such as providing color guard support at various functions, working with KVMH and other entities in mass casualty exercises, and recently supported the Kauai In Step Program.

For our Special Education Department (SPED), inclusion is being done at a larger scale this year, in the past inclusion was done only in English, this year we have added inclusion in Math and Social Studies.

Though low in previous years, our band now boasts 38 band members. Please mark your calendars to attend our Winter Fine Arts Expo which is scheduled for December 12<sup>th</sup> at the Kauai Community College Performing Arts Center. The Expo will showcase our, Band, Chorus, Hawaiian Dance, and Ukulele students. Our Photography classes will host an exhibit at this event as well. A number of our band members and hula students will travel to New York City as part of the Hawaii All State Marching Band to participate in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade.... Go Big Blue!

Our CTE courses in Culinary Arts continue to excel. On schedule are dinners, luncheons as well as breakfast events for parents, teachers, and guests throughout the year. Mr. Souza is in the process of creating a school garden to provide fresh herbs and greens for class use.

Blue Print Reading & Drafting using the Auto Cad Program is a course offering in CTE. Done in cooperation with KCC, Mr. Altomare teams with instructor Jon Lucas in this partnership. The Graphics class continues to provide designs and printing of shirts for school clubs and sports teams. Vinyl banners and decals are part of their repertoire of products. The Building & Construction partnership continues with KCC, instructors Glenn Taba and John Lucas work closely with Mr. Uyehara in this endeavor. Our Big Blue Crew continues to film athletic events for H Hawaii Media, streaming events to be broadcast live on site.

Our Social Studies Department plans to participate in the upcoming National History Day Competition, last year we were the only high school participants on island. Two of our students went on to become state level winners. During the second semester students involved in economics will have the opportunity to work on the Bloomberg Station working on stock market simulations. In effort to support senior project research, US History has students write a research paper on a Great American or an American President, utilizing Modern Language Association (MLA) format citations.

Our Science Department prepares student to compete in the Ocean and Science Bowl. Freshmen students will participate in the Science Fair as part of their course requirements. Teachers utilize the Gizmos program from Explore Learning.com and Achieve 3000 World of Biology for supplemental science materials. Mr. Kakuda will take a team of students to Oahu the first week in December to compete in the Pan Pacific VEX Robotic Championships. The ROV program continues in Partnership with STU Inc. Students travel to the Hilo in May to compete against other schools in the state.

The Math Department will continue work with math consultant Ellen Duffy this year, with our focus on making sense of the Common Core State Standards. Plans are being made to coordinate a day to work with Kapaa High School teachers, allowing for horizontal articulation between schools – observing, dialoguing etc...The Rocketry Program, although difficult to ship in materials has a launch scheduled at PMRF in December.

**Waimea High School is a Title I School**

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 ensures that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards. For this reason, Federal Title I funds become available to schools in need. The minimum amount for a school to qualify to become a school-wide Title I is 40%. This means 40% of the student population qualifies for free or reduced priced meals.

Title I funds are used in the following ways at Waimea High School: provide teacher professional development, provide support for students in the classroom during the school day, provide for parent involvement activities, and/or purchase supplemental classroom resources/supplies. Supplemental Educational Services (SES) for after school tutoring for qualified families are also provided.

**NCLB Supplemental Educational Services (SES)**

The Title I program is offering free after school tutoring in reading, math, or science to qualifying students. To be eligible, students must qualify for free or reduced price meals and have an academic need in reading or math. Semester report card grades are also used to determine eligibility. Applications will be sent home twice a year to qualifying families via postal mail in October and February. SES tutors are hired by non-Department of Education Providers. **And a Reminder: Home-School Compact**

One of the requirements of the Federal Title I program is that each school receiving money must complete a Title I Home/School Compact. The Home/School Compact outlines the responsibilities of all the participants – the students, the families, the teachers and the administration of Waimea High School. Title I and Waimea High School believe that when the family and school work together, student learning is maximized. The Home-School Compact was sent home with our students via their Advisory Classes on September 20. Just a reminder to those who have yet to return the signed Home-School Compact, please sign and return it to your student's Advisory teacher as soon as possible.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

It is with great concern that I ask you to please discuss and talk with your child/children about the dangers of bringing any firearm to school. Firearms do not belong in school, on the school bus, and/or at school-related activities. In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), Title 8, Chapter 19, section 8-19-6(b), firearms include BB guns, air guns, paintball guns, handguns, rifles, and any instrument that may be readily converted to expel a projectile. If your child/children is/are found in violation of a firearm offense, he/she will automatically be dismissed from school for at least one calendar year. Only by my review on a case-by-case basis, can the length of the dismissal be modified.

"Be Cool! Don't Be a Fool In School!" is our annual statewide campaign to remind you of the consequence of a firearms violation. Please discuss with your child/children the attached flyer emphasizing personal safety, what are appropriate safe school behaviors, and the consequence. Always be aware of what your child/children are doing and what they may be bringing to school in their backpacks.

At class meetings held in the gym I reminded students that it is all about RESPECT. Students were told if they act in a RESPECTful manner; to each other; to adults; towards all school property; towards all school rules/initiatives, that they will have a wonderful school year. Students were told that **the goal** is to have a safe and secure campus so teachers can teach and students can learn.

Parents/ Guardians could assist w/ the safe campus aspect and academic atmosphere by:

- Always signing in at the office before walking on campus
- Delivering items to the front office only... do not deliver items to classrooms
- Dropping students by the front of school only... not driving up the road toward the upper campus
- Reminding your students to do their detentions when assigned by the teacher or due to a 'tardy'

Contact the Administration w/ any concerns regarding your student

Enforcing school and classroom rules helps Teacher ensure an academic, learning atmosphere in the classroom. Teachers and administration assign after-school detention to students who disrupt the academic atmosphere. Students are expected to attend detention on the assigned date. Enforcing the 'tardy' policy also helps to maintain the academic atmosphere of the school. Any student who is tardy to any class throughout the school day will receive an after school detention. Students have been informed that they are expected to do that detention on the closest "A" day. Students are expected to attend detention with out reminders and are considered insubordinate when they do not attend assigned detentions.

The English Department worked hard this summer in refining the senior project handbook. It is posted on the Waimea High School Website. The project handbook is extensive and alignments to common core state standards are included in the handbook. The Accelerated Reading Program (AR) promotes student reading, students who read a million words are awarded and recognized with a million word club T-shirt.

Our Student Services Department plans on hosting a variety of parent nights, including a College Planning Night held last month. Plans are currently being made to host a Financial Aid Night in December. Ms. Chaffin, our registrar and 9<sup>th</sup> grade counselor will be visiting our feeder schools Chiefess Kamakahalei and St. Theresa on 11/28/2011 to assist students with registration for SY 12-13. Students and their parents / guardians from Waimea Canyon School are invited to incoming Freshmen Advising on December 8, 2011. Informational letters will be sent home shortly.

Our teachers came in for articulation within their departments this past summer. Their efforts resulted in common syllabi for teachers with common courses. Departments worked on creating common assessments for like courses as well. For example the Social studies department worked on creating their units for Modern Hawaiian History and Participation in Democracy, as well as created common grading rubrics. A team of eleven members made up of teachers, counselors, and both administrators worked for a week this summer reviewing and revising the Significant Adult lessons created at the onset of the program to align with the Personal Transition Plan.

If any of our projects were not mentioned, it was not intentional. There are many exciting things happening at Waimea High School, we appreciate the hard work and dedication of our faculty and staff. We commend our students for their efforts in academics, athletics and volunteerism. We thank our school community... parents, guardians, and community members for supporting us in our efforts to increase student achievement and our school improvement process.

**Important School Bus Procedures Change - Effective October 11, 2011**

This is to inform you that, effective Tuesday, October 11, 2011 the Department of Education will implement a change to its school bus pass policy that will affect all school bus riding students. Beginning October 11, 2011, all High School students who fail to display a valid bus pass or present a valid bus coupon in the mornings will be refused a ride to school. Also, all students in all grades who fail to display a valid bus pass or present a valid bus coupon in the afternoons will be refused a ride home. All students who attempt to board a school bus without a valid bus pass or coupon will be reported to the School Principal on the Form ST-15 (School Bus Incident Report). Principals are encouraged to investigate and resolve such reports expeditiously to avoid further disruptions in school bussing services for students.
