# Inappropriate Language

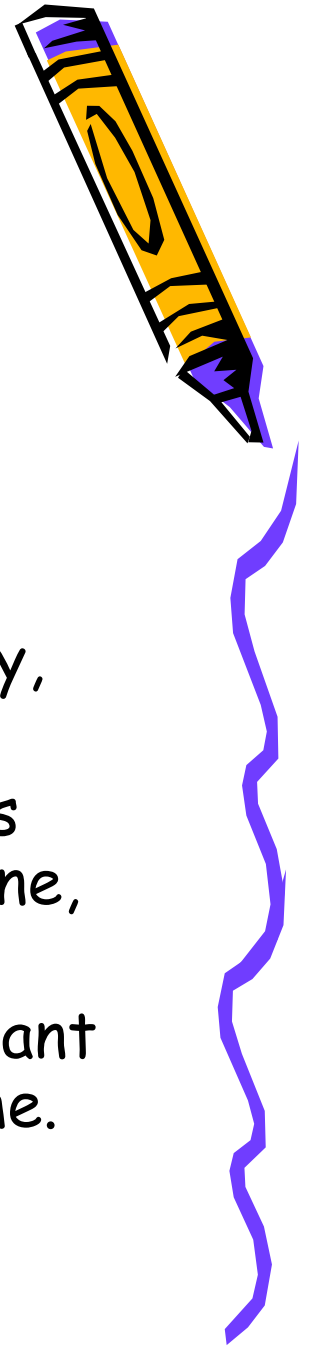
- Students who use inappropriate language **directed at any adult staff member will be suspended**. Second offense of this nature will result in two days of suspension, a third offense will result in three days of suspension.
- Students who use inappropriate language directed at fellow students whether in dialogue or anger will be assigned consequences according to teacher's classroom rules. If teacher consequences have been tried, exhausted and properly documented, the student will be referred to administration for suspension.

Counselor to schedule post suspension counseling upon completion  
of suspension.*



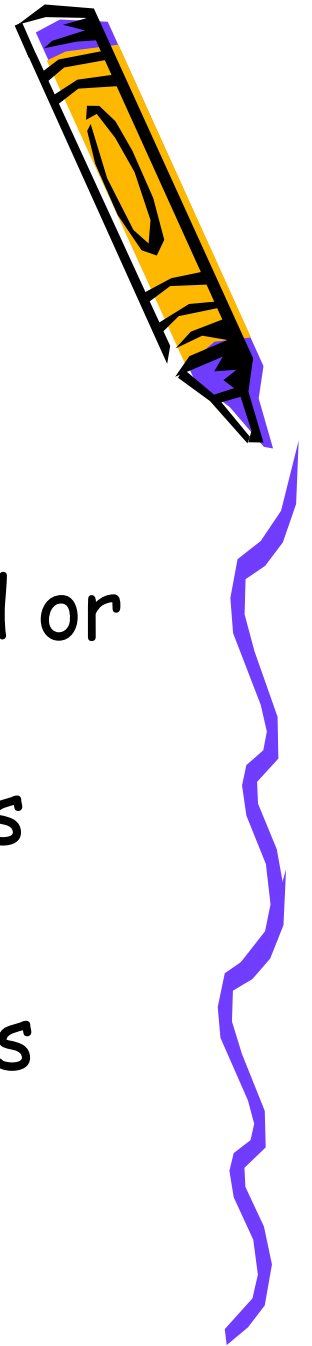
# Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment

- Harassment, cyberbullying or bullying are not respectful behaviors and are not tolerated
- What exactly is Bullying?
  - \* The intention to do harm- physically, mentally, sexually or emotionally
  - \* Imbalance of power, i.e., many people versus one person, a bigger person versus a smaller one, or a louder person against a quiet person.
  - \* It can be a single incident if it has a significant impact, but more often it is repeated over time.



## Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment (continued)

- What is Cyberbullying?
- When a student feels any of the following: tormented, threatened, harassed, humiliated, embarrassed or targeted by someone using the internet or any digital technologies or cell phone
- If communication involves a serious threat, one time= cyberbullying



## Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment (continued)

- Chapter 19 (see booklet for details)
- Harassment: means a student who is harassing, bullying, including cyberbullying, annoying, or alarming another person ...
- Refer to Ch 19 booklet for more details



# School Wear

Students will comply with the adopted School Wear Policy.

- Students shall wear an approved "School Wear" shirt on all school days.
- Students are not to alter, turn inside out, tie, or twist their school wear shirts.
- School wear must be worn, not carried in a backpack, slung over the shoulder or worn as a "necklace." **There is no excuse.**



# School Wear

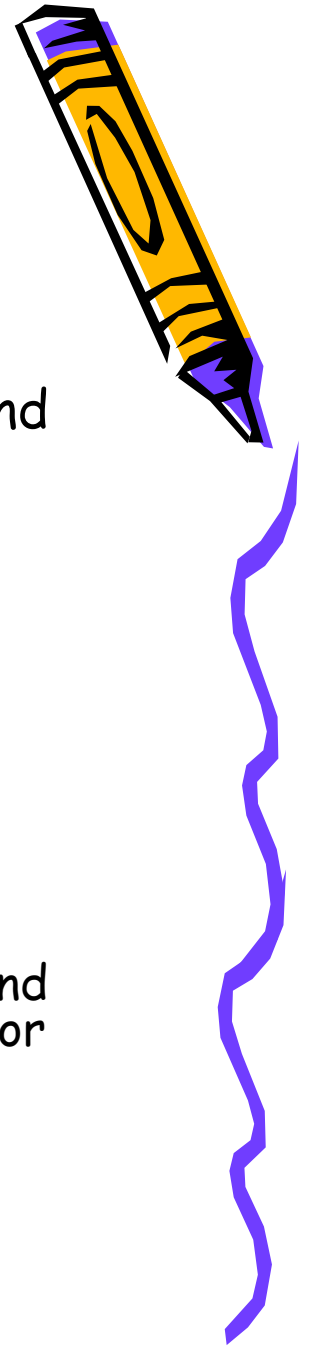
Consequence for school wear violation

- parent / guardian contacted, shirt to be procured and one hour of after school detention



# Cheating

- All students are expected to produce their own work and assignments.
- Cheating is defined as .....
  - Copying another student's work.
  - Allowing another student to copy your work
  - Plagiarism - claiming someone else's work as your own.
  - Distribution of answers to a test, paper, assignment etc... verbally, in writing or through the use of technology.
  - Anyone caught cheating will be automatically suspended and given a zero for that test or assignment. Consequences for cheating will be progressive.



# Electronic Equipment

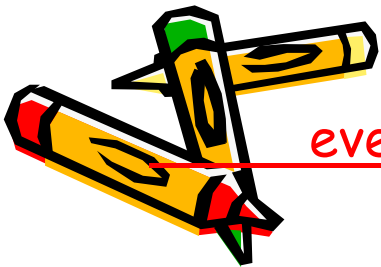
MP3 Players, Play Station Portables, IPOD and any other electronic devices including cell phones will be automatically confiscated if used during class time. Parent / guardian contact. Item may be picked up in the office once student has completed 1 hour of after school detention.

If the item is confiscated for a second time, your parent / guardian will be asked to pick it up upon your completion of **two hours** of after school detention.

**A third time will result in parent / guardian contact for a suspension.**

*Counselors to schedule post suspension counseling.*

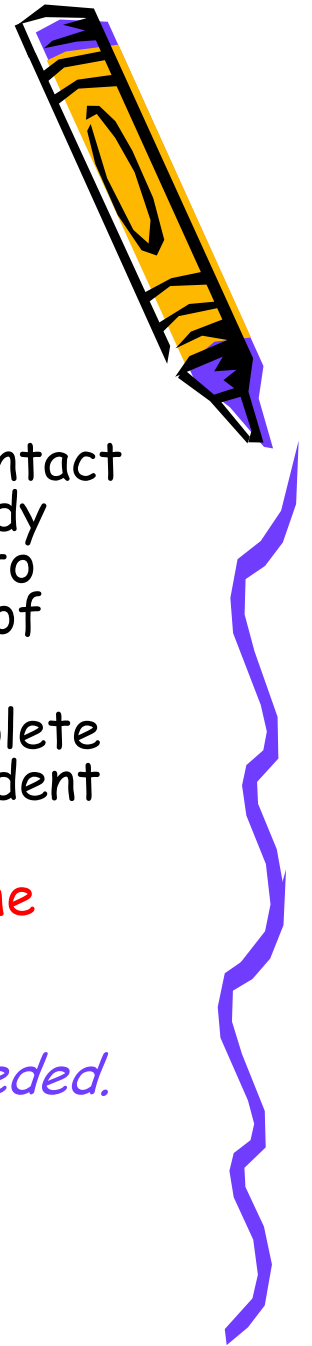
Teachers have the authority to enforce this policy even if used while going to the bathroom, counselors. etc...



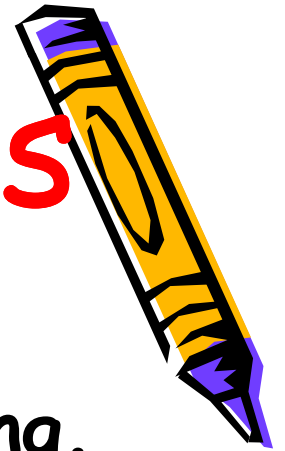
# Tardies

- Students are to report to the office for a tardy slip. Teacher to mark accordingly. Attendance Clerk will contact parent / guardian to inform them that student was tardy and will serve one hour in the detention room. Failure to report on assigned day will result in an additional hour of detention.
- Student may be suspended should he / she fail to complete detention. Suspension may be administered should student continue to be tardy.
- Any student who arrives more than 15 minutes after the tardy bell will be marked absent for the day.

*Counselor to schedule post suspension counseling as needed.*



# Off Limits Areas

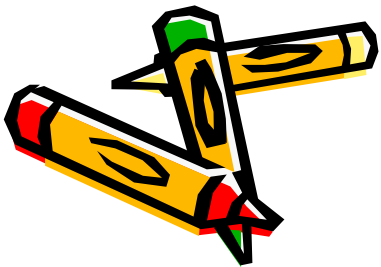
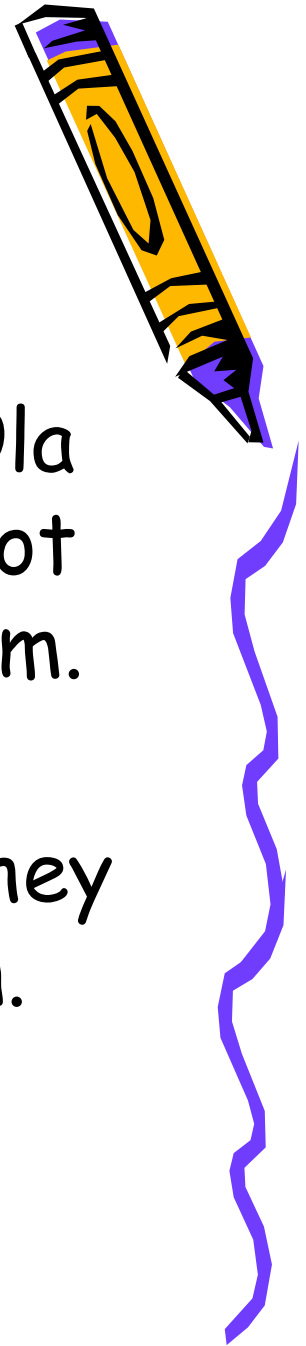


- ⌘ Cemetery
- ⌘ Back and on the sides of band building.
- ⌘ Back of the old dispensary as well as its parking lot.
- ⌘ Behind vocational and agriculture buildings
- ⌘ Behind Art building - Haina Road
- ⌘ S,T,U building - second floor
- ⌘ Front lawn railing is off limits - students are expected to refrain from sitting on railing.



# Off Limits Area continued.....

- All of Haina Road, Makeke Road, Ola Road, Tsuchiya Road, and parking lot behind of Foreign Church Classroom.
- Student Parking area, no student should go to their vehicle unless they acquire a pass from administration.

# STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT (cont.)



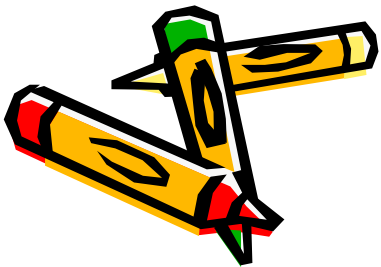
## Respect for Self and Others

## Respect for Property

Students are expected to be responsible and care for our buildings, equipment, and textbooks. Students are expected to treat all property belonging to the school and others with care.

## Freedom from fear

Students are expected to contribute to a safe school environment free from fear. Acts of violence, weapons, and contraband are never acceptable.



# Punctuality

- Students are expected to arrive to school on time - First bell rings at 7:45 and the tardy bell rings at 7:50. Remember the passing periods are just five minutes long. Students are expected to be on time for all other classes during the day.
